



Welcome to Kirkstead Autumn Term Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you and your child/children have all had a relaxing summer and that they are looking forward to the beginning of their new school adventure. I would like to take this opportunity to share all the Kirkstead routines with you and everything you need to know to get this year off to a great start.

Drop off/Pick Up

The day will start with the children coming in through the KS1 gate which will be open at **8.35am**. Please bring your child to the KS1 playground. The bell will ring at **8.40am**, at which point the children will line up in their classes and be led inside by their class teacher for the register. For this first week, you are initially invited to bring your child through the classroom and help them find their coat peg and tray before saying your goodbyes. The following week the children will be encouraged to come in independently. The KS1 gate will be opened at **3:10pm** and the children will be collected from the classroom door at **3.15pm**.

Topic

In the first two weeks our class topic is **'Hello'**. This is where the children will talk about themselves and about what makes them unique, and talking about their families. This will be followed by the topic **'Wonderful Weather'**. The children will be finding out about Autumn and be able to identify some seasonal changes. They will experience the natural world around them first hand in Forest School and looking at the different types of weather they encounter in their first term.

Reading and Phonics

The children will be taught daily phonics using our fantastic scheme Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised. Alongside our phonics scheme. In week 3, the children will initially bring home Little Wandle picture books to share in school and at home. Once ready the children will move on to reading **fully decodable** reading books. These phonics books will include sounds that your child has learnt, and they will have shared the book with an adult in school before they bring it home. As a result of this, your child should be able to read it independently. In addition to the phonics book, they will also take home a 'sharing' book that they will **not** be able to read independently and is designed to be shared with a grown-up. They may, of course, choose to read something they have at home for this instead.

Little Wandle books will be sent home on a **Friday** from week 3. Please return the book on the following **Friday**. The books we have purchased are a valuable resource and we kindly ask that you keep the books in good condition so they last as long as possible. Sharing books will be changed on a **Monday** and **Wednesday**.

Every child will have a 'Home School Record' with their reading books for yourself to record when your child has read. Dojo points are awarded for daily reading, but only if the home school record is signed. If the home school record is not signed, or if the book is not returned to school, your child will not be able to choose a different book.

Mathematics

In the first few weeks the children will explore routines and timings, they will be encouraged to develop their positional language as they talk about the objects in their outdoor and indoor provision. The children will be learning how to quantify sets of objects up to 4 by subitising, rather than counting. When subitising, children can say how many there are in a small group of objects by 'just seeing' and knowing straightaway without needing to count. They will be developing their knowledge of counting sequences up to 10 with practical activities and singing counting rhymes. Their learning will be supported by the Numberblocks programme.

P.E.

PE will take place every week on **Monday**. Please send your child to school in their PE kit with their school uniform and school shoes in a separate bag ready to get changed into after PE. All of your child's school uniform, shoes and PE kit must be named. The P.E kit should be appropriate for indoor and outdoor P.E and should consist of a **white t-shirt and black shorts**.

Forest School

From week 3, the children will be taking part in weekly outdoor Forest School sessions and they will **need to have clothing appropriate to the weather**. This should consist of named trousers, long sleeved top and wellies or boots. This clothing will be kept at school until the end of the term.

Homework

Homework will be given out each Friday in the homework folder and is expected back in school on the following Thursday. This term the children will receive a handwriting home learning task every week.

Baseline Assessments

In the first 6 weeks, each child will be participating in the reception baseline assessment (RBA). The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point to measure the progress schools make with their pupils. The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school, using materials that most children of your child's age will be familiar with. It was statutory for all schools from September 2021. Fruit and Water

The children will be given a healthy snack (piece of fruit) each day. We encourage drinking water regularly so please send your child in with fresh water every day in their named water bottle.
