I hope you've all enjoyed the sunny half term break!

Our history topic, 'Walls and Barricades', continues this term - we will be looking at physical barriers (Great Wall of China, Hadrian's Wall, The Western Wall). Last term we focused on the social barriers (Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela, Ghandi and Martin Luther King), which received an amazing response from the children, engaging in many deep, thought-provoking discussions, demonstrating excellent understanding of the struggles people have faced. We will link this with our English writing, starting with narrative - the children will write a story with a main character that faces challenges of a social barrier. Later in the term, our English focus will be debates - I'm looking forward to this one!

Science - we will be investigating Sound and Vibrations - with some exciting experiments!

Maths - I hope that MTC's haven't been forgotten over the half term break! **MTC's will take place the week beginning 8th June.** Please remember to support your child to use the following website -

RE - This term, we will continue to learn about the importance of pilgrimage to everyone, whether that be religious or non-religious. We will look at some of the spiritual journeys made. For more in-depth information on our RE curriculum, please see our school website.

PE lessons will take place on **Tuesday and Wednesday**. Please ensure the children have the correct PE kit for outdoors - please see the school website if you are unsure.
