Dear Families,

We want to give you as much information as possible about the age-related expectations for your child and an information leaflet has been designed that will help you understand what your child is learning in school and will support any homework.

A great day was spent listening to, and working on, your child's 'Book of the Month' or the book that is displayed on their classroom door. We also held a reading café at both schools and these were really well attended – thank you.

It is also fair to mention that we had a few visitors at Swineshead last week. The school had a Section 5 Ofsted Inspection and we hope that the report will be available before the end of term. The children behaved impeccably throughout and are a credit to you and the school. Staff also worked tirelessly and were very helpful and accommodating throughout. The praise for staff is compounded by the fact that they also had parents' evening at the same time, so had very little time to rewrite lesson plans or create things that are not already there. This is not such a bad thing as the Inspectors were able to see the school as we are – on a journey with lots of it being absolutely amazing!

Sutterton Fourfields and Swineshead St. Mary's

An 11+ Club will be running at both schools after the Easter half-term in preparation for September.

This year SATs WEEK is Monday 14<sup>th</sup> – Friday 18<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

It is most important that all Year 6 pupils attend school during this week. The date for the KS1 SATs will be with you shortly, but will probably be the last fortnight in May. We are offering an Easter KS2 SATs School on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> – Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> April from 10:00 am until 1:00 pm. It's only a short period of time for your child if they are in Year 6 and it will be invaluable.

National Down's Syndrome Day will take place on 21st March and the children are encouraged to come to school wearing odd socks (all different/all the same/all equal). The children will listen to books about Downs Syndrome. We also have National Autism Day on 27<sup>th</sup> March and the children are encouraged to wear something pink or purple and our assemblies that day will be based around promoting understanding.

## Attendance Matters

Most children have really good attendance. The importance of it shouldn't be underestimated. Children need to be in school regularly if they are to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them by law. There is a clear link between good attendance in school and achievement in class and it is really difficult for a child to try to 'catch-up' when they have not been in school. Any child whose attendance falls below 95% will receive a letter and this will be followed up until the attendance is back to at least 95%.

If a child's attendance falls below 85%, this is classed as persistent absence and leaders have a duty, again, by law, to ensure every step and measure is followed to try and improve attendance and get it back to 95% or above. Please note that if the persistent absence continues, the Educational Welfare Officer will be informed and legal proceedings, such as fines, may be applied for. If you have any concerns or need help with this matter, the school will do everything in its power to try to help and support you.

## Sporting News

We have a very active sports scene and we have competed in every event offered within the Boston and District Partnership.

The Boccia Festival and Goalball was one of my personal favourites. It was extremely inclusive and supportive, but with a super-competitive edge.

Sutterton entered a dance team and came a very respectable second place at the Dance Festival. The dance is available on Twitter and I'm sure you will be impressed by the children's composure, creativity and teamwork.

We have also had a couple of development days where the children had the opportunity to go off-site and learn or develop a new sporting skill. We also hope to field new athletes in an up-coming tennis tournament.
