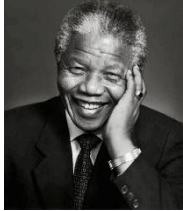




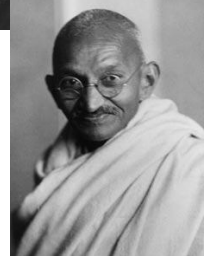
Sempringham Class - Term 5 2026

This is a fantastic topic which promotes a huge amount of thought and discussion and feeds in nicely to our English writing - newspaper reports, letters, debates and speeches.

In Science we will be investigating Living Things and their Habitats - always a popular topic with the children!

Maths - I hope that MTC's haven't been forgotten over the Easter Break! The beginning of June is quickly approaching, and scores were improving well before the break. Homework reminder:

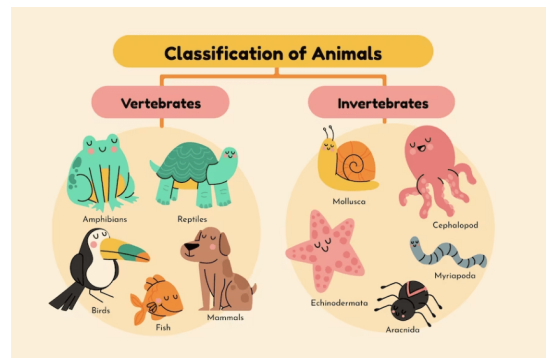
