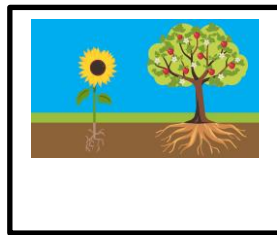
### Drop off/Pick Up

The KS1 gate will be open at **8.35am**. Please bring your child straight to the red double doors where their teacher will be waiting for them. The KS1 gate will then be opened at **3:10pm** and the children will be collected from the red double doors at **3.15pm**.



### Geography

This term we are learning about **Britain and The World**. We will be exploring what makes the United Kingdom such a unique place. We will be learning about the four countries that make up the UK and the **seas and oceans** that surround our islands. We will also be taking a closer look at the capital city of **London**, discovering its famous landmarks, important buildings, and why it plays such an important role in the UK today.



### Science

This term we are learning about **plants**. The children will be learning all about how plants grow and why they are so important. We will be exploring the different parts of a plant talking about what plants need to stay healthy, such as sunlight, water and soil. The children will also be looking closely at different types of plants and trees, spotting similarities and differences, and enjoying opportunities to observe real plants growing in our environment.



### RE

This term in RE our topic is **'is there a right way to worship?'** In this unit, we will be learning about **different worldviews** and how people **express their beliefs through worship**. We will be using simple **philosophical questions** to think about ideas like *right* and *wrong*, helping the children to develop early critical-thinking skills. We will also reflect on how a person's **background and context** can shape the way they choose to worship.

## Reading and Phonics

Children will continue to bring home their phonics books on a **Friday** and these need to be returned to school the following **Friday**, unless they are on the fluency program, where their books are brought home **fortnightly**. In addition to the phonics book, they will also take home a 'sharing' book that they will **not** be able to read independently and is designed to be shared with a grown-up. They may, of course, choose to read something they have at home for this instead. Sharing books will be changed on a **Monday** and **Wednesday**.



Every child will have a 'Home School Record' with their reading books for yourself to record when your child has read. Dojo points are awarded for daily reading, but only if the home school record is signed. If the home school record is not signed, or if the book is not returned to school, your child will not be able to choose a different book.

## P.E.



PE will take place every week on **Tuesday**. Please send your child to school in their PE kit with their school uniform and school shoes in a separate bag ready to get changed into after PE. All of your child's school uniform, shoes and PE kit must be named. The P.E kit should be appropriate for indoor and outdoor P.E and should consist of a **white t-shirt and black shorts**.

## Homework

Homework will be given out each Friday in the homework folder and is expected back in school on the following Thursday.

## Fruit and Water

The children will be given a healthy snack (a piece of fruit) each day. We encourage drinking water regularly so please send your child in with fresh water every day in their named water bottle.

## Picking up after school

If someone other than the usual person will be picking up your child after school, please let us know.
